2. Plank road got its name because it was built by laying planks side by side to allow for horse drawn wagons carrying crude oil to refineries in Sarnia from Oil Springs and Petrolia
3. Alexander McKenzie who still plays a prominent role in Lambton County today.

6. Bright's Grove Library located in the Faithorne House in Wildwood Park built in 1958-60 by Colonel Robert Faithorne, son in law of Henry Jones Sr.
